**Counties are classified using Urban Influence Codes: Metropolitan (UIC: 1,4), Micropolitan (UIC: 2,5,7), and Rural (UIC: 3,6,8,9). In general, metropolitan counties include those with an urban area of 50,000 or more people. Micropolitan counties include an urban area with at least 10,000 and fewer than 50,000 people. Rural counties have no urban areas with 10,000 people. Metropolitan and micropolitan areas also include outlying counties that are economically tied to the central counties as measured by labor force commuting.
